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Contexte

Les conflits violents ont pris de l'ampleur ces dernières années et, en 2016, plus de pays ont connu un conflit violent qu'au cours des 30 dernières années. Bien que la relation complexe entre conflit, sécurité et développement soit de mieux en mieux comprise, l'assistance internationale et les investissements dans la prévention des conflits sont restés relativement faibles. Parallèlement, les approches en matière de prévention des conflits ont été considérablement affinées au fur et à mesure de l'évolution des politiques et des pratiques en matière de consolidation de la paix - et l'ONU, ses États membres et d'autres partenaires considèrent de plus en plus la prévention comme une stratégie essentielle pour maintenir la paix et favoriser le développement. La prévention des conflits est de plus en plus reconnue comme une stratégie rationnelle et rentable pour les pays exposés au risque de violence et pour la communauté internationale.

The joint UNDP-DPA programme on building national capacities for conflict prevention has made a ground-breaking contribution in bridging the gap between political engagement and development assistance in pursuit of preventing conflict and sustaining peace. In its new phase (2019-2023), the Joint UNDP-DPPA Programme will further strengthen the analytical capacities of national stakeholders and the UN system in support of Member States' efforts to advance policy and programmatic coherence on conflict prevention and support strategies for sustaining peace. The new phase of the joint programme is accordingly designed such to contribute to two mutually supportive outcomes:

Outcome 1: Targeted initiatives and national capacities are more effectively contributing to conflict prevention and sustaining peace.

Outcome 2: UN Country Teams are increasingly conflict sensitive, have developed conflict sensitive country strategies, and are leading partnerships on sustaining peace.

The programme has been reconfigured to maximise its contribution in the context of ongoing reforms to the UN Peace and Security architecture and the UN Development System, building also on prior experience and lessons learned. A rigorous monitoring framework will ensure a results-based approach to programme implementation, clarity of work streams, and consistent, interactive engagement with donors/development partners.

The deployment of Peace and Development Advisors and has been the primary instrument of the Joint Programme to provide capacity for Resident Coordinators and UN Country Teams to support national partners in dialogue and national or local mediation processes, the establishment and operationalisation of national infrastructures and mechanisms for peace; and other initiatives aimed at sustaining peace. There are currently 49 PDA positions across the globe.

In an effort to ensure that PDAs are better equipped and empowered to deliver on their mandates, the Joint Programme is deploying Regional Programme Specialists located in regional offices to provide back-up support to PDAs and UNCTs in the areas of conflict analysis, conflict sensitive programming, the strengthening of local capacities for dialogue as well conflict prevention. Regional Programme Specialist can also be deployed to provide surge expertise or short-term technical support to Resident Coordinators in contexts where there are no PDAs. Interim support can be offered in contexts where support is urgently needed ahead of arrival of a full-time PDA or where unforeseen risk or crisis necessitate urgent advisory support to be provided to the RC.
